

## ministry update

While we begin to enjoy the celebrations of Christmas, the ongoing season of Advent reminds us of the anticipation, even the expectation, of the people of Israel for the Messiah. While they waited for God to fulfill his promise of deliverance, some Jews lost hope, and others remained faithful. There were some bumps along the way, but we continued to learn about course design and development through the process. The small group of students included linguists who train Bible translators. We were grateful to help them extend their ministry through online education, even as they helped us with feedback on the new course.

Please pray for our upcoming and ongoing sessions of *Effective Online Teaching*. We have two sessions of this training scheduled for the New Year. My colleague Rob and I will teach the course in January with theological educators participating from Asia, North Africa, Europe, South and North America. Starting in February, my colleague Brian will teach the Portuguese version to partners working primarily in Brazil. Presently, a partner has just started this training in Russian with one of our Horizon staff co-facilitating. We have another partner who is currently

facilitating this training themselves for their faculty. We aim for multiplication and contextualization—local trainers equipped to train other local trainers.

Once again, thank you so much for partnering with us in ministry this year. We greatly appreciate your involvement in training church leaders across the globe.
